Paul has reinvented his rock garden into a conifer garden of great beauty. He has been propagating from cuttings for at least twenty-five years, using both choice conifers and evergreen shrubs he has purchased as well as cuttings harvested from plants of fellow rock gardeners, and he has grown these cuttings on with much success. The previous rock garden, a raised area to the southeast of his house, is now a garden of year-round interest - at least in a less snowy year!
