The meeting was a real treat! The sun was shining, temperatures neared 60 degrees and we were enlightened by Andy Brand of



and we were enlightened by Andy Brand of <u>Broken Arrow Nursery</u> in Hamden, Conn. The nursery was founded by Dick Jaynes after spending 25 years as a Plant Breeder and Horticulturalist at the Connecticut Agriculture Experiment Station. He specialized in Kalmias and Chestnuts.

Andy the Nursery Manager has been there for 25 years. His talks: "Spectacular Natives! "& "Diversity and Beauty from the Wilds of America." He shared many marvelous pictures taken by him and his birder friend Jim Zipp. Andy stressed many times how butterflies rely on native plants. Some examples were Tulip Trees, corydalis, milkweed, Butterfly weed, Mt. Laurel and Chokeberry. His grand finale included additional pictures of native plants and butterflies accompanied by Ray Charles's rendition of America the Beautiful! You Can't beat that combo! Andy also shared catalogues and many treated themselves to his lovely selection of dwarf plants.
