Further Questions Asked during the Presentation from Panayoti Kelaidis:

1. Jan Jeddeloh: Why do you think many plants are happier in a trough than a garden and do you think this generalizes to other climates, for example Oregon's rainy climate?

I believe troughs work everywhere providing better drainage and exposure: I have seen outstanding troughs in Portland and Seattle--which use a lot more gravel and drainage than we do in Colorado.

2. Harrietrobinson: Are these troughs all in full sun?

Most I showed you were in full sun: I have shady troughs with primulas and saxifrages at home.

3. Laura: Do your troughs need winter protection? for Colorado 7000 ft

No: I don't think they do in Vail where they have dozens of troughs at 8000'

4. **Jamie Ellison, Canning, NS:** Hello PK from Nova Scotia. I am wondering about the hardiness of *Echinocereus viridiflorus*.

E. viridiflorus is extremely cold hardy: you may have to protect from moisture in winter.

5. **Anonymous:** What do you do for weeding your troughs?

Not many weeds--use tweezers or sharp knives: out biggest "weeds" are plants we put in that take off too much like phlox and Clematis tenuiloba.

6. **Ann Littlewood:** I would love to hear more about establishing and maintaining troughs from PK
